



# RACE NOTES

#### Second Midwinter Race - March 8, 2014:

The weather for the second Midwinter was encouraging...blue sky, smooth water, a slack tide, but...barely a breeze. Well, winter on the Bay is like that, and it feels so good to get back on the water, even if it requires a wait for the wind.

There were 14 boats entered for this second Midwinter, and 12 optimistic skippers brought their boats out to the starting line for a 1pm start. Such a good turnout was evidence that the racers were ready! But, the wind was not. Oh well, a wait is not unusual for a midwinter, and it will be worth the wait. At 12:50, I called for a 20-minute postponement, thinking that the wind was imminent. But it was not. After 20 minutes, there was still no sign of wind, so I called for another 20-minute postponement. As the second postponement was expiring, all could see occasional ripples on the water appear and fade. The flags on the race deck would occasionally flutter and droop. By now, the boats had spread out from the line, and a few reported hopeful signs of wind where they were. Unfortunately, the signs were more hope than wind. With a flood tide about to start, and no real evidence of wind, I called for another postponement.

To make a long story short, at 2:15pm there was still no sign of wind, so the handwriting was on the wall; there would be no race today. Skippers were growing tired of the wait and starting to bring their boats back to their berths. We officially postponed the race until March 29<sup>th</sup>, so we could sail two races to make up for not racing today.

Back at the club, the disappointment for not racing turned into acknowledgement that it still had been nice to be on the water, if only to drift. And, two races on the 29<sup>th</sup> was deemed a good solution. Racers, by their nature, are an optimistic lot.
