

### The Benson Ford: An elegant piece of history recycled

The *Benson Ford* originally transported iron and coal for the Ford Motor Company. The boat was used by Henry Ford himself to travel across the Great Lakes and Thomas Edison was a frequent guest on this beautiful ship. Decommissioned in 1981 after nearly 50 years of service, it was left to rust for four years before the front part of the ship was removed and perched on top of an 18-foot cliff above Lake Erie to serve as a vacation home.

Originally owned by Frank J. Sullivan, who tried to turn it into a hotel in 1992, Sullivan eventually put the building up for auction. Father and son Jerry and Bryan Kaspar bought it and they still enjoy relaxing there while taking time off from work. It has now been modernized with a garage, game room, a bar, state-of-the-art kitchen, and four bathrooms.

The present four-deck ship house has an area of 7,000 square feet and includes a walnut paneled state room, dining room, galley, and passenger lounge designed by Henry Ford for his own personal use while on board. It boasts five bedrooms, a captain's office and a living room with panoramic views across Lake Erie.

The deck on the fourth floor is a great place to enjoy a cocktail overlooking the lake and nearby cliffs, especially at sunset. Videographer Nick James, who conducts tours of the home, said, "The most incredible part is standing at the helm. With the way the boat hangs over the cliff, it actually feels like you are out on the open water."
