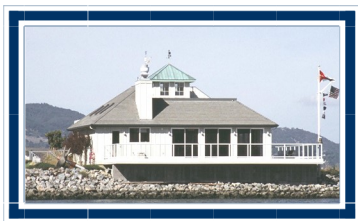

RACE NOTES

June brought warm weather, the longest days of the year, and ushered in some spectacular summer racing at TYC. The racing started with Friday Night Race Number 3 and the CYC-TYC Friendship regatta, followed by Friday Night Races 4, 5, & 6; and finished with the races 1 and 2 of the H.O. Lind summer series.

I'd like to start off by thanking everyone who volunteered for Friday Night Dinners and for helping with RC. We've had a lot of great events this past month, and it's in no small part due to all of our great volunteer members. I'd also like to sincerely thank Steve Nimz and Bill Hoehler for getting our inner start/finish line buoy, Panda, back in place after it was recovered last month, having gone for a trip down to Paradise Park. It's great for the racers and the RC to have a proper start and finish line back in place—dredging barge placement notwithstanding.

Friday Night Race Number 3 was held on June 3 under very light breeze and a strong tide. Eight boats—three in the spinnaker division, and five in the non-spinnaker division—made up the fleet. RC sent the spinnaker boats on Friday Night course number nine, a trip to the R14 and TYC marks before heading to the finish line, while the non-spinnaker division was handed the slightly shorter course number two, which sent them to TYC, GRC, and ISO finally to the finish line. The spinnaker division all finished the course in a little over an hour, with Richard Selmeier's *Hurricane Gulch* crossing the finish line second to Aaron Wangenheim's *Bravo*, but correcting out for the win. Unfortunately for the non-spinnaker division, a significant wind hole formed around the GRC mark, which combined with the exposure to the tide, proved to be unreachable for the fleet, and eventually all the non-spin boats retired.

The CYC-TYC Friendship Regatta was held on Saturday, June 4 with CYC hosting the regatta this year. Six TYC boats—*Miramar*, *Lion* and *Don Wan* in the non-spin division, and *Joyride*, *Siento el Viento* and *Hurricane Gulch* in the spinnaker division—made the trip down the Tiburon peninsula to race as a team for the Friendship trophy. The CYC RC set up the starting line out in the breeze off of the Knox area of Angel Island and sent the fleets on a central bay tour before heading into Raccoon Straits and the infamous Elephant Rock mark to line up a finish off the CYC clubhouse. Racers were challenged by a range of wind conditions on the course from heavy, shifty wind at the start, to very light and patchy air near the finish line at the end of the day.

In the spinnaker division, Bill Hoehler's *Joyride* managed to cross the finish line second behind the Melges 32 *Kuai*, and earned a spinnaker division win on correct time by less than one minute over second place in a race that took most boats two hours! *Siento el Viento* managed a sixth place on corrected time, while *Hurricane Gulch* came in a couple of places behind that in eighth. In the non-spinnaker division, TYC's best finish came from fourth place *Miramar*, with *Lion* correcting to finish ninth, and *Don Wan* correcting just behind in tenth. Alas, in the points for the team competition, TYC came up short compared to the armada of boats that CYC was able to field for this year, and CYC finished with 23 points to TYC's 38. So the Friendship trophy traded hands once again, and will live with CYC, but hopefully just until next year when it will be TYC's turn to host the Friendship Race.

Racing at TYC for the month of June concluded on Saturday the 25th with races 1 and 2 of the H.O. Lind summer series. Three divisions were made, consisting of an Ultimate 20 one design fleet, as well as the usual spinnaker and non-spinnaker divisions.

Conditions at the start of race 1 had a solid but light breeze coming from just south of east, and a building flood. RC sent the U20 and spinnaker fleets on TYC's standard course 16: a downwind start to ISO, followed by a windward leg to GRC, a leeward leg back to ISO, and a short beat to the finish. For the non-spinnaker fleet, RC sent them on standard course 14, sending them upwind from the start line straight to GRC, then reaching over to the TYC mark before deep reaching back to the finish. So the start was little like the 'Fiasco,' with two divisions starting downwind one way, and the third starting upwind going the other direction. *UAgain* and *Joyride* finished atop their respective fleets in race one, while *Lion* took first place in the non-spinnaker fleet, with *Cinnamon Girl* close behind in second.

During the latter part of race 1 and in the time between race 2, the breeze really picked up (low to mid 20 kts), and shifted to its more usual direction out of the SW. RC sent the U20 division out on course 11, which gave

them a trip to the TYC mark before a long downwind leg to C15, an uphill return to TYC mark, before reaching down to the finish line. The spinnaker and non-spinnaker divisions were given the slightly shorter course 10, which replaces the C15 leeward mark with a rounding of R14. *UAgain* took first (again!), while *Ultimate 20 Breakaway* bounced back from a DNF in race 1 to take second place in race 2. *Joyride* managed another bullet in the spinnaker division, with *Siento el Viento* correcting into second place a couple of minutes behind. Otto Schreier's *Galante* earned a solid race 2 win after a fourth place finish in race 1, and Mariellen Stern's *Cinnamon Girl* stayed in the hunt with another second place finish for race 2. The H.O. Lind series continues with races 3 and 4 on July 23.

Looking ahead to July, in addition to the H.O. Lind series, we've got the Brothers and Sisters Fourth of July Race, the always interesting Fox Hat Race after that on July 16, and Friday Night Racing every week.

CRUISE TO LOCH LOMOND YACHT CLUB, SAN RAFAEL: JULY 8-10

TYC hasn't cruised to Loch Lomond in some time due to harbor depth issues, but recently completed dredging has made this club a cruising destination once again. That being said, a word of caution regarding San Rafael Canal channel: While LL marina was recently dredged to 10', the same cannot be said for the main channel (dredged to 5' about two years ago). However, tides will be reasonably favorable with low tide at 1000 on Friday and rising thereafter, and roughly an hour later each successive day. For power boats there should be no problem. Sailors are advised to time their entries and departures accordingly. Loch Lomond has its own visitors' dock where power boats can stern tie. Sailboats may need to side tie, but there is usually ample room in the harbor.

Those coming Friday are welcome to join LLYC members for a \$15 tri-tip dinner. Deadline for reservations is Tuesday, July 5. Saturday dinner for cruisers, LLYC members, and other guests: Roast pork with seasonal vegetables, mashed potatoes, salad, rolls, and seasonal fruit cobbler for \$25.

For her first TYC meal, Chef Pia offers you the flavors and aromas of her native Philippines. She's also planning an Italian dinner for August.

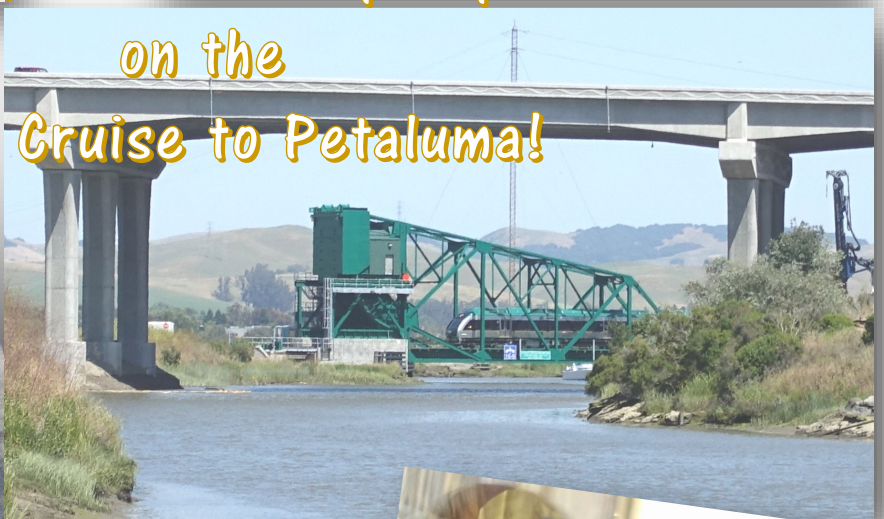
