## RACE NOTES

#### BY JIM BLISS



#### Behrens Regatta - Saturday May 17 - Three Races

It was a sunny day with light wind and a good turnout for the Behrens Regatta. Nine out of 11 registered boats showed up, due in part to a delay in starting the first race, which allowed boats from the South Cay to catch the incoming tide, giving them enough depth to get out.

The fleet was divided into two divisions based on PHRF. The spinnaker boats started first at 12:05pm. Both divisions sailed course #14, a triangle of 2.6nm going out to GRC in the center of the bay, then to TYC and back to the finish. The wind was light from the south and the flood tide was strong, making it a classic choice of wind vs. tide. Those who went out into the flood made out over the boats who stayed in the lighter flood because the wind was stronger in the center of the bay. Racing is always a guessing game. The best at it were *Joyride* in Division 1 (by only 28 seconds over *Triple Play*) and *Wind Dance* in Division 2.

In the second race, both divisions sailed course #1, a windward-leeward course of 2.5nm going to TYC, then up to ISO (the tripod), and back to the finish. The wind was slightly stronger than in Race 1.The spinnaker boats started at 13:40 and the non-spinnaker boats five minutes later. The beat to TYC is always a challenge, steering and hoping for the lifts approaching TYC in order to avoid the extra tack if they don't occur. After rounding TYC, the boats stayed close for a good finish, with *Triple Play* finishing first in Division 1 by 42 seconds and *Don Wan* finishing first in Division 2 by 23 seconds.

The third race started at 14:50 with both divisions sailing course #2, another windward-leeward course of 2.4nm going to TYC, back to Hopeful (the starting line), returning to TYC, and then the finish. With the wind stronger and the flood tide decreasing, it was a faster race of less than 30 minutes elapsed time. Division 1 winner was *Joyride* and Division 2 winner was *Diversion*.

The final standings for the 2014 Behrens Regatta: Bill Hoehler on *Joyride* took first in Division 1, and Jerry Gunn/John Sullivan on *Diversion* took first in Division 2. Trophy glasses were presented in the club after the races, and a good time was had by all. Thanks to the race committee of Steve Nimz on the VHF and Suzie and Lon Woodrum for making it happen.

#### Rules for Beginners Clinic - May 23

The first Friday night race was preceded by a 'Rules for Beginners' presentation by Ian Matthew. It was highly successful, with an audience of about 20. Ian covered the basics of racing, starting with the first rule: Avoid a collision. The second rule: Sailboats do **not** have rights over ships. Ian then explained how races are started, and the three basic rules of racing: 1) When boats are on opposite tacks, the starboard boat has rights; 2) When boats are on the same tack, the leeward boat has rights; and 3) A boat tacking has no rights until he has completed his tack. With that basic information, a new racer can go out and race safely. Because the clinic was so well received, Ian has offered to make it a regular pre-race event, if there is demand, and to move beyond the basic rules of racing.

#### Friday Night Race #1 - May 23

There was a good turnout for the first Friday Night Race of the season. Twelve boats came to the starting line. The race committee, led by Lon Woodrum, split the fleet into three divisions based on PHRF: three boats in Division 1, four in Division 2, and four in Division 3. The 12<sup>th</sup> boat was an unregistered newcomer, *Know What*, sailed by Bud Conrad, who was racing for the first time.

The wind was mild enough for boats to use their larger jibs. The faster Division 1 boats were given course #10, taking them to TYC, up to R14 in the center of the bay, back to TYC and finish. *Ma's Rover* finished first, while *Miramar* and *Triple Play* finished second and third, respectively. Divisions 2 and 3 were given a shorter L-shaped course, taking them to TYC, out to GRC, back to TYC and finish. *Hurricane Gulch* finished first in Division 2, while *Brigadoon* and *Diversion* finished second and third, respectively. *Galante* finished first in Division 3, while *Wind Dance* and *Coaster* finished second and third, respectively. Detailed results of Friday Night Race #1 are posted on Jibeset.

There will be separate competitions for the Friendship and X-Bay perpetual trophies, with team scores based on the best combined 10 scores from each club. The start will be in the Knox area, west of Angel Island. The first warning will be at 12:55pm from a CYC signal boat and race committee. The race will involve a tour of the city front with its challenging winds and currents and tactical options, finishing in Raccoon Straits. All competitors are invited to raft up in the CYC harbor after the race (and Friday night, if you want to come the night before) and to participate in the post-race festivities, including a no-host bar, music, trophy presentations, food service at the Pelican grill until 5:00pm, or regular dinner service starting at 6:30. Sailing Instructions and an online entry form for this race are available at <a href="http://race.cyc.org/xbay">http://race.cyc.org/xbay</a>. The entry fee is \$20, and payment is made by credit card on the entry form. Entries should be submitted by Wednesday, June 11.
