
All submissions will be edited for grammar, content, size and relevancy. Inclusion is up to the editor's discretion.

RACE NOTES

This past May was an active month for racing at TYC: The Cinco de Mayo Race and Club Birthday Party were held on Saturday May 7; Ian Matthew presented a racing and race committee seminar at the General Meeting on Friday the 13th; a windy three-race Behrens Regatta was held on May 14; and we kicked off the Friday Night Race series on Friday May 20.

El Niño came to play at the Cinco de Mayo Race in the form of a cold and wet weather system on the day of the race. However, these conditions did not dampen the competitive spirit of most of the registered racers as five boats geared up to race. Volunteering for Race Committee were *Joyride's* owners Bill and Susan Hoehler.

The racers and race committee were presented with a shifty southwest breeze in play with a flood tide to consider. The race committee kindly postponed the start to allow for *Siento el Viento* and her crew to help tow *Wind Dance* out to the course, after she had some engine trouble up at the dock. Once all the competitors were out to the starting area, RC announced course 12, a 7.3 nautical mile, four-leg affair.

It was a clean start for the fleet and a one-leg beat to TYC before heading downwind on a run to the R16 channel marker near the Brother Islands. The strong flood tide in the channel made fetching the mark an exercise in sailing sideways. *Lion* rounded first, followed in close pursuit by *Cinnamon Girl*, *Siento*, *Don Wan*, and *Wind Dance*. It was on the return beat to TYC that *Lion* gained distance on the rest of the fleet by heading inshore for relief from the flood tide while *Siento* and *Cinnamon* sailed windward beat farther offshore. A short, broad reaching leg from TYC to the finish completed to course and Lon Woodrum's *Lion* finished first after almost 1:49 on the course. *Siento* crossed in second place six minutes later, and *Cinnamon Girl* five minutes after that, which was close enough to correct out over *Siento* for second place. *Don Wan* crossed the line fourth and corrected to the same.

The Race Chair would like to thank Ian Matthew and the crew of *Siento* for retrieving our wayward inner start line buoy, Panda, after they finished racing. Panda had drifted to a location southwest of the Coast Guard mooring buoy, nearer Paradise Park, after the ground tackle became tangled in fishing gear.

Just a week after the Cinco Race and party, TYC hosted a rousing three-race Behrens Regatta on May 14. Two fleets were organized with five visiting Ultimate 20 boats making up a one design fleet, and six familiar TYC boats comprising a PHRF division (2 spin, 4 non-spin). Race Committee was run on the water by the Race Chair crewing shorthanded on *Joyride*. Conditions on the course were fresh with strong breeze out of the southwest against an ebb tide.

Race one was short: course 1, windward-leeward-windward. There were tight starts in both fleets and the windward mark roundings were close. The brief course kept finish times close, and race one finished up as follows: U20 division - 1) *UAgain*, 2) *Salsa*, 3) *Uhoo!*; PHRF division - 1) *Joyride*, 2) *Lion*, 3) *Galante*.

Race two was the longer course 10, which sent the fleets to the TYC mark then down to R14 and back before heading to the finish off the clubhouse. This race was decided the way to and from R14 with Aiden Collins' *Neverland* and Lon's *Lion* both sailing strong legs downwind wing-on-wing and keeping Bill Hoehler's *Joyride* from pulling away under her asymmetric spinnaker. *Neverland* crossed the finish line second to *Joyride* but managed to correct out by a couple of minutes for a race win, with *Lion* earning a third on corrected, and Otto Schreier's *Galante* correcting out just a minute behind *Lion*. In the U20 division *Uhoo!* got the gun for race two, while *Breakaway* earned their second place finish and *Salsa* stayed in the hunt overall with a finish in third place.

Course five was sailed for the third and final race of the regatta. Course five, was as long as the course selected for race two, but made up of a box shape in place of two sausages. The breeze and waves were up at this point from earlier in the day, and it sure looked like the U20 crews had their hands full while keeping their boats flying down the lumpy

course. *Salsa* earned a first place in race three over *UAgain*, and in doing so managed to edge out *Uhoo!*, who finished third, for first place overall by one point in the standing. *UAgain* would finish third overall in the standings, just one point behind *Uhoo!* and two points behind *Salsa*. (cont...)

In the PHRF division, the longer and stiffer boats were able to capitalize on the rougher racing conditions. *Joyride* took an early lead and this time was able to open up some distance on *Neverland* going downwind, while *Galante* powered through the chop to keep up the fleet. *Joyride* would get the gun and win on corrected time over *Neverland* by only 40 seconds, while Otto Schreier's *Galante* corrected out over *Lion* for third place by an even smaller margin of six seconds. Overall standing for the Behrens Regatta PHRF fleet were: 1) *Joyride* (4 pts), 2) *Neverland* (8), and 3) *Lion* (9).

Coming up in June for TYC racing we have the TYC-CYC friendship race on June 4, H.O. Lind races one and two on June 25, and Friday Night Racing every week. Also, a brief reminder: If you are regularly racing at TYC, please help the Race Chair by volunteering to be RC for a race. Email race@tyc.org for your preferred RC event.
