2013 Blue Water Medal To Jeanne Socrates

Remember Jeanne Socrates, the woman Alice Shinn brought to TYC last November to give us a presentation on her solo-sailing travels around the world? Well, listen to this:

The Cruising Club of America has selected Jeanne Socrates (Ealing, West London, England) to receive the Blue Water Medal for her comple-

tion of a solo nonstop circumnavigation of the world on her third attempt.

The Blue Water Medal was first awarded in 1923 and is given "for a most meritorious example of seaman-ship, the recipient to be selected from among the amateurs of all nations." The award will be presented at the annual CCA Awards Dinner on March 7, 2014 at New York Yacht Club in Manhattan.

After 259 days alone and unassisted at sea, Socrates sailed past the Ogden Point breakwater in Victoria, on July 8, 2013 at 2:26 a.m., completing her nonstop goal and becoming the first woman to sail nonstop around the world (on a route that started and finished in North America) and the oldest woman to sail solo nonstop around the world.

Socrates is raising money for Marie Curie Cancer Cure, a British program that offers free home nursing for terminally ill cancer patients. Links to the charity can be found by visiting her website, svnereida.com

The wind was good enough to race, so lan and Gary agreed to go ahead and sail the shortest course, as long as they were out there. Both boats finished Course 1 (to TYC and back) in under 15 minutes, with *Siento El Viento* first across the finish line. Since they were in separate divisions, each was awarded a first place and a single point for their efforts, giving them a big point advantage for the series over the five boats in each division that did not start.

Non-starters received eight points each (fleet +2) as a DNC. The short race allowed them to get back to the club early for their prize and some post-race socializing, and still get home for some Saturday non-sailing chores.
