Race notes

It's been a few issues since I've written Race Notes, so this installment looks back a little farther than usual, recapping some of the great summer racing we've had.

Reaching all the way back into July, we had a very breezy and fun Brothers and Sisters Race on the 4th, with five boats on the water, all finishing the long course in under two and a half hours. The Fox Hat, held on July 16, was a similarly fast and windy affair, with four boats participating (*Joyride, Siento el Viento, Highlander* and *Adagio*) but all declaring non-spinnaker. Despite not deploying her chute, *Joyride* hit 12 knots of boat speed reaching under jib and main from Alcatraz to Red Rock on her way to a first-to -finish and a corrected win. After sailing in such fresh conditions, the consensus at the clubhouse was that everyone had a good ride around the islands.

August brought with it the final three Friday Night Races: The Moseley Invitational Regatta, the last installment of The H.O. Lind Summer Series, and the TYC Championship Tornberg Regatta.

Our Moseley Invitational Regatta was a great success, with 22 boats attending in three classes (Knarr, Folkboat and Etchells) and champagne summer sailing conditions. The all-volunteer "on-the-water" TYC Race Committee ran three great windward-leeward courses for each class. Skippers Ethan Doyle (sail #1229, Etchell) and Peter Jeal, aboard *Polperro* (Folkboat), won their classes with straight bullets, while in the hotly contested Knarr fleet skipper Graham Green and his crew aboard *Gjendin* earned their class win with a decisive 1-2-2.

I'd like to extend special thanks to the TYC members who helped run this year's Moseley Regatta: for Race Committee - Lon & Susie Woodrum, Steve Nimz, Tracy Hansen, Rita Pirie, Mariellen Stern, Jeanine Wilford, Dave Eichorn, Max Geller and Ian Matthew (in spirit and back office); in the galley - Michael Zhao; and at the bar - Patty Cerf and Fumi Cooperband.

The H.O. Lind Summer Series wrapped up on August 20. In the spinnaker division, Bill Hoehler's *Joyride* took two first place finishes and the series win over *Siento* and *Don Wan*, while in the non-spinnaker division, Lon Woodrum's *Lion* earned a first and a second to secure the series win over *Galante*, and rival Olson 25 *Carpe Vita*. Our visiting fleet of Ultimate 20s could not attend the final two races, so the final standings have skipper Mike Josselyn on *Uhoo!* (13 pts with two bullets) taking first over John Wolfe's *Breakaway* (17 pts).

Most recently, TYC's season championship Tornberg Regatta was held under sunny skies and fluky winds. Eight boats entered and Race Committee decided to let them do battle all together in one class, regardless of LOA, sail inventory or PHRF rating. The three-race day had drifter conditions for races one and three, and a gusty, short race two sailed as a couple of sausages around the TYC mark and the start line. At the conclusion, *Lion* and her crew capped off their strong season by easily taking first in the regatta, scoring five points with a 1-2-2. Second place went to Bill Hoehler's team aboard *Joyride* with eight points (6-1-1). Ian Matthew's *Siento el Viento* rounded out the top three with 13 points (4-5-4). Fascinatingly, race one saw a tie for second place on corrected time between Mariellen Stern's *Cinnamon Girl* and Rob Clark's *Carpe Vita*, for which they both scored 2.5 points. *Cinnamon Girl* went on to beat *Carpe Vita* for fourth place by only one point!

Looking forward to October, we have the Joan Storer Women's Regatta on October 15, and both the Red Rock Regatta and Halloween Costume Party on October 29.

SALMON DERBY REELS IN DINNER AT TYC

Three good-sized salmon and a mess of rockfish were dinner for 60 appreciative club members Saturday, August 27 at the club's 11th Almost Annual Salmon Derby.

Jerry McNulty's 15-pound salmon took first prize, a marine radio donated by Johnson Hicks of Sausalito. Second prize went to Dave Eichhorn, whose 13-pound salmon earned him a haulout from Bay Marine Shipyard of Richmond. Both anglers fished outside the Golden Gate aboard guest skipper Brian Swayne's boat, *Searenity*. Jerry, Dave and their fish earned the club some local press coverage, appearing in articles and photo spreads in Tiburon's *The Ark Newspaper* and the *Marin Independent Journal*.

But this event is less about prizes and glory than about putting on a fresh fish dinner for the members, a tradition going back 16 years. So unlike most angling contests, the salmon are cleaned before weighing. The poundage isn't as impressive but they taste better.

And we were just as excited about the 31 rockfish hauled in by the crew of *Hawkeye*, filleted and cooked up into fish tacos by guest Rich Newsom, as we were about skipper Wayne Behrens' 12-pound, third prize salmon that won him a lunch for two from Western Boat and Tackle.

Prizes to the rest of the rockfish crew—John Pesce, Gerry Fults, Stan Behrens and Rich Newsom—included a TYC t-shirt and a cap and shirt from the Matthew Turner Educational Tall Ship.
